Introduction and scope of collection

Sherman W. Church was a Norwalk civil engineer. James W. Hyatt served a term as treasurer of the United States, 1887-1889. Both families have roots in the town's colonial era. The collection consists of personal and business ephemera, genealogical notes and papers on the Church and Hoyt / Hyatt families, letters and personal legal documents.
